First Holy Communion Thanksgiving Mass is on <u>Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> June 2025, 11.30am</u>. Children will be doing the readings and the offertory for that Mass.

TEA/COFFEE: On Sunday 15th June 2025, please note there is no Morning tea after the 11.30am Mass.

FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRISTI (CORPUS CHRISTI): Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> June is the Feast of the Corpus Christi. The Corpus Christi procession will take place after the 11.30am Mass. (After the post Communion prayer) This is a Catholic tradition where the Blessed Sacrament is carried through the streets to publicly proclaim the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. It's a public expression of faith and worship, often held on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The procession will start from Church, Mitcham Lane towards Ambleside Avenue, Tooting Bec Gardens Road and then back to the Church. The procession will include:

- The priest carries the Blessed Sacrament, often in a monstrance, symbolizing the presence of Christ
- Participants will sing hymns and prayers, expressing their faith and adoration.
- We would like to invite everyone to join in and especially all the Children who will be receiving their First Holy Communion this year.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF THE HOLY COMMUNION: All Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharistic, please note 21st/22nd June 2025 weekend during Mass you will be invited to renew your commitment as an Extraordinary Eucharistic Minister.

BAPTISM AT ENGLISH MARTYRS CHURCH: Baptism is a Sacrament of faith, and the Church asks for a serious and loving commitment by the parents and godparents of a child to live the life of the Sacraments. Parents wishing to baptise their child at English Martyrs Church Streatham should be living in the parish for more than 6 months. If you belong to another parish you will need to obtain a letter of permission from your parish priest. If you are new to the Parish, you can get a letter from your previous parish to say that you are a practising Catholic. Baptisms to take place on the last Sunday of every month at 2pm. The date will be confirmed once the preparation course is completed. Please collect a Baptism pack from the parish office for registration at least four weeks before the preparation date.

JOURNEY IN FAITH: We warmly invite those adults seeking Baptism/Confirmation/Holy Communion to be part our Journey in Faith group. DAY FOR LIFE: There will be a second collection this weekend 14/15th June 2025 for Day for Life. This is the day in the Churches life dedicated to celebrating the sacredness of life. The proceeds provide core funding for the Anscombe Bioethics Centre and to assist other life related activities supported by the Church, usually by means of grants made to support Catholic charities.

ENGLISH MARTYRS This week's Martyr is BLESSED JOHN HALE, whose name appears on ceiling of the right-hand side of the main church, close to the Altar. He was the Vicar of Isleworth in Middlesex (now West London). He was charged with numerous offences against Henry VIII on April 20 1535 in reliance on a written memorandum which had been prepared by a fellow priest, Robert Feron, to whom he had denounced Henry VIII expressed in strong terms his view that the King was a heretic and that his repudiation of Queen Catherine of Aragon made him a sinner. Robert Feron was also charged with being a heretic and both men pleaded guilty but Feron was pardoned. John Haile was sentenced to death and was hanged at Tyburn (near Hyde Park in London) on 4th May 1535, now of course the date of the Feast of English Martyrs.
