MONTH OF THE ROSARY: The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. The Rosary, at its core, is a contemplative prayer where we meditate on the life, passion, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ through the eyes of His beloved mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary. The repetitive nature of the Hail Marys provides a rhythmic backdrop that allows the faithful to think deep into these mysteries, drawing them closer to both Jesus and Mary. People use the rosary to ask for help with various intentions. For example, these intentions include world peace, stopping abortion, or praying for souls in Purgatory. Ultimately, we pray the rosary to grow closer to God and praying the rosary is not just for challenges or difficulties. Praying the rosary helps us fortify our Catholic beliefs and strengthen our bond with Jesus Christ.

During the Month of October, at the end of the bidding Prayers, instead of the Hail Mary, we shall sing the Salve Regina. (Hymn no: 628) Salve Regina. Mater misericordiae

BAPTISM AT ENGLISH MARTYRS CHURCH: Baptism is a Sacrament of faith, and the Church asks for a serious and loving commitment by the parents and godparents of a child to live the life of the Sacraments. Parents wishing to baptise their child at English Martyrs Church Streatham should be living in the parish for more than 6 months. If you belong to another parish you will need to obtain a letter of permission from your parish priest. If you are new to the Parish, you can get a letter from your previous parish to say that you are a practising Catholic. Baptisms to take place on the last Sunday of every month at 2pm. The date will be confirmed once the preparation course is completed. Please collect a Baptism pack from the parish office for registration at least four weeks before the preparation date.

INDUCTION MASS OF CANON GREGORY VERISSIMO: The Parish of the Good Shepherd Downham has, cordially invited all parishioners of English Martyrs Church to the induction ceremony of their new Parish Priest Rev Canon Gregory Verissimo by the Episcopal Vicar for the South/West London Area of the Archdiocese of Southwark, Rev Canon Victor Darlington on the 31st of October 2025 by 6.30pm. ## ENGLISH MARTYRS - This week's Martyr is St Cuthbert Mayne

St Cuthbert's statue stands near the back of the Church on the left-hand side as you face the altar. He was, like his friend St Edmund Campion, ordained first in the Anglican church but chose to become a Catholic priest and returned from France to England following his ordination in 1576 to work as a missionary priest in Cornwall, despite the very grave threat to Catholic priests at that time, Queen Elizabeth I's agents heard of his presence and searched for him. When he was found, he was reputed to be wearing an Agnus Dei (a Lamb figure representing the Lamb of God), and this was used in evidence against him. He was sentenced to death. Perhaps we can remember St Cuthbert, his faith and courage, when we say the Agnus Dei/Lamb of God, before holy Communion.
