PEACE SUNDAY: PAX CHRISTI: Today is Peace Sunday. Pope Leo has announced the theme – 'Peace be with you all: Towards an 'unarmed and disarming peace' – and we are putting together liturgy and prayer resources to help you mark the day and reflect on this vital theme in your parish or group. Pope Leo has continued the exhortation of Pope Francis that the call to live nonviolent 'disarmed' lives is core to Catholic Social Teaching and the key to peace in a world scarred by violent conflict.

PAX CHRISTI (International Catholic Movement for Peace) produces resources on peace and nonviolence issues, organises events and vigils, represents the Catholic church in the peace movement and works with young people in both schools and churches.

Their website suggests ways we can all become better peacemakers. SECOND COLLECTION: There will be a second collection next weekend (24/25th January 2026) for St George's Cathedral. For over half a century, St George's Cathedral has been the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Southwark, home to 175 parishes and over 50,000 Roman Catholics. For many Catholics living and working across London and the South East of England, St George's has been a beacon of light. Today, St George's Cathedral continues to attract thousands of worshippers and visitors each year, as well as serving a lively local parish community which proudly reflects the rich cultural and ethnic diversity of South London. The Cathedral frequently hosts important Diocesan and national celebrations, as well as concerts and events for various Catholic charities. There is a rich musical tradition, maintaining a choir of boys and men, as well as a girls' choir, both of which sing at Sunday Masses and on major feasts. In many respects, St George's Cathedral serves as a spiritual home and 'beehive' for Catholic evangelisation and mission across the Archdiocese of Southwark. St George's Cathedral is entirely reliant upon the generosity of its parishioners, volunteers and the Archdiocese of Southwark to keep its doors open. It does not receive Vatican or government funding, nor has an endowment to rely on. Your support can enable the Cathedral to remain open daily to those seeking a place of peace, prayer and worship. You can donate through by cash/cheque, using the card machine or the QR code in the poster at the back of the Church.

BAPTISM AT ENGLISH MARTYRS CHURCH: Baptism is a Sacrament of faith, and the Church asks for a serious and loving commitment by the parents and godparents of a child to live the life of the Sacraments. Parents wishing to baptise their child at English Martyrs Church Streatham should be living in the parish for more than 6 months. If you belong to another parish you will need to obtain a letter of permission from your parish priest. If you are new to the Parish, you can get a letter from your previous parish to say that you are a practising Catholic. Baptisms take place on the last Sunday of every month at 2pm. The date will be confirmed once the preparation course is completed. Please collect a Baptism pack from the parish office for registration at least four weeks before the preparation date.

ENGLISH MARTYR FOR THE WEEK is JOHN ROCHESTER. John was one of many Carthusian Monks who were persecuted because of their refusal to agree that King Henry VIII was the final authority on religious matters in England. At this time, the monks, based at Charterhouse in London, enjoyed great status and prestige due to widespread respect for the simple and holy lives they led. Faced with a refusal to accept the King's authority, the King ordered that Monks be arrested and in May 1537, John was taken to York where he was found guilty of treason and hanged. When faced with their deaths, the Carthusian monks refused to deny their faith and their loyalty to the Catholic church and bravely accepted that for this they would die.
